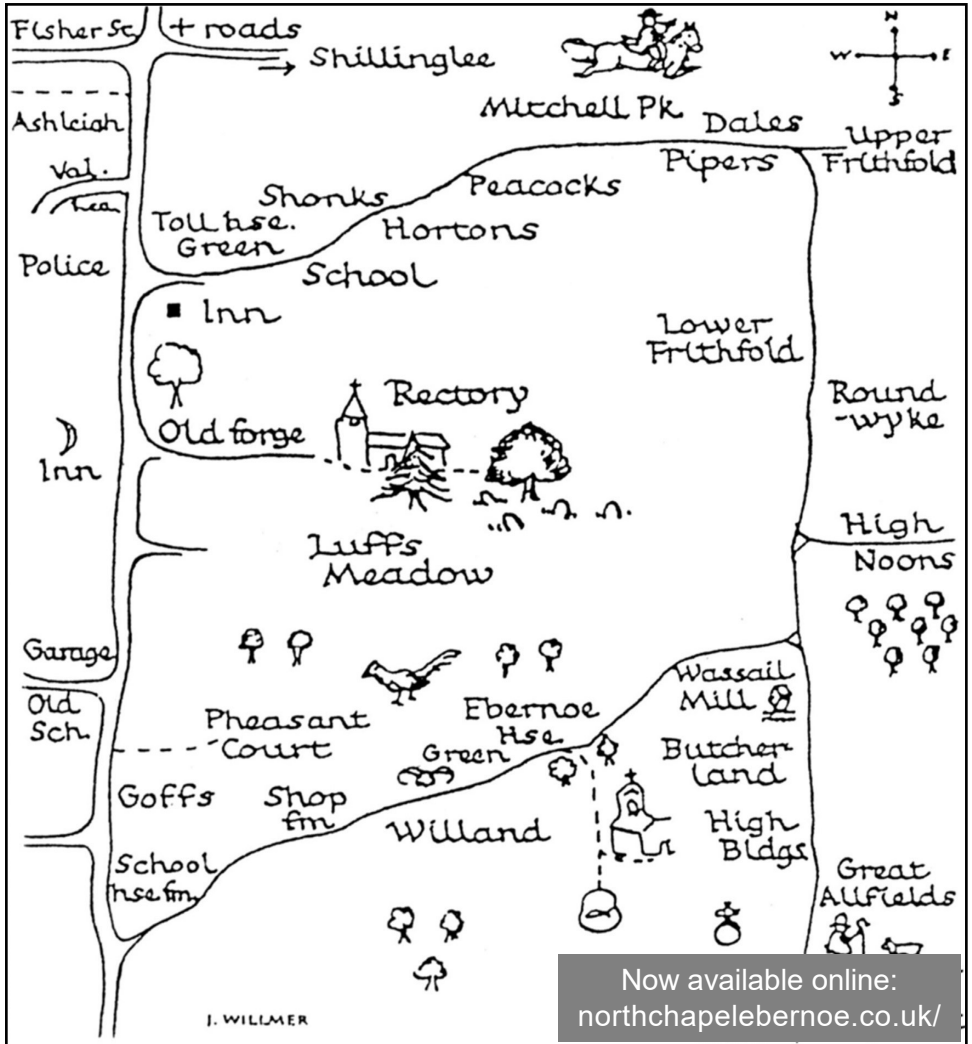

Lest we forget

News From Ebernoe Reserve

At the end of September the West Weald Fungus Recording Group marked their 30th anniversary with a visit to Ebernoe. Their first foray was to the reserve in 1993 and they celebrated their 20th in September 2013, followed by lunch at the Stag's Head. A pattern which they repeated this year. The hot, dry, weather this year meant that fungi were rather thin on the ground but they still found quite a diversity. However, one striking fungus that has been visible and has appeared in several areas where I have not noticed it in the past is the Magpie Inkcap. At one site we could see three specimens showing different stages of development – elongated egg-shape; a more open bell shape; and one beginning to disintegrate at the edges into a black inky fluid.

Because of some issues related to TB testing the cattle had to be taken off the reserve in August. Whilst Furnace Meadow and the southern half of the reserve had been grazed by then the northern part of The Common had not. Concerned that this could have an adverse effect on the flora in the main glade the SWT rangers erected electric fencing and brought a flock of Herdwick sheep in to graze the glade. These quickly made inroads into the vegetation and it will be interesting to see the effect this has on the plant diversity.

The main task for my volunteer team in October was to clear Bracken, Bramble and young Holly from the two Wild Daffodil areas in the SW corner of the reserve. However, on our way there, we first had to deal with two Birch trees and a large chunk of Beech which had fallen across the public footpath. Hopefully, our effort to control the coarse vegetation in the daffodil areas is working as we seemed to clear the areas more quickly than in previous years.

Elsewhere on the reserve SWT have a contractor putting in four new bridges – three on the stream in Willand Wood and one at the southern end of the reserve on the footpath towards Pugs Bottom and Langhurst. A contractor is also being used to 'cut and collect' in one of the old field compartments in the south and use a mulcher to break up some of the Bramble blocks at Butcherlands.

Farm Diary *by Sue Moss*

Autumn sowing is well under way here at the farm, spreading the dung from our storage pit was completed in a couple of days in preparation for cultivating the fields. A number of fields have been sown with Wheat, we are trying a new variety this year that is used for milling rather than being used for animal feed. Barley has been sown in the fields that surround the farmhouse. The new crops have germinated well and the fields have a green covering as the crops begin to grow.

The forage crop of radish and turnips at Honeydowns has grown well, the radish have gone to seed and have a very pretty white bloom. In a few weeks the crop will be grazed by our Store Lambs, the remainder of the crop that is not eaten will be worked into the soil as a green fertiliser and Oats will be sown in the spring.

A lot of the young calves have been weaned and are now in large pens in the new barns, Andy has reached his target number of 300 calves on the farm. Thankfully the regular deliveries of calf milk powder at £1900.00 per ton will gradually cease ! We still have larger cattle outside, we will bring them inside when the weather deteriorates .

The Rams have been returned to the early lambing group of Ewes to cover any that didn't get pregnant first time around. The Ewes that will lamb in March next year have had Rams put in with them for the first time. My pet Zwartble sheep have also had a ram put in with them , my very old pet Marge the Herdwick has gone on a ram-free holiday to Hillgrove as she is far too old to be put in lamb anymore. I miss her smiley face when we check my sheep each morning.

We endured and passed the Red Tractor Inspection for another year, a day that that we don't look forward to, it is a thorough check on regulations and standards that we farm by. There is a lot of record inspecting, Rob is responsible for Medicine Records, a task recently made easier by recording on WhatsApp each time a drug is administered, Andy is responsible for everything Cattle related and accompanies the inspector around the farm, Julian keeps the Field Records and Sheep Movement Records and we all do some of the general work involved. I'm pleased that over the years I have passed most of my responsibilities on to Andy and Rob.

The mole I mentioned last month is no longer causing destruction to our lawn!

As I close the diary this month, the rain forecast from storm Babet is threatening to stop us completing our fieldwork, Julian has been working late to finish spraying the Wheat with Herbicide and Insecticide and Rob is still working in the field near the Sewage Works trying to get the field sown with Beans. If we get the rain that is forecast we will not be able to work on the fields with the tractors.

Once more I am delighted to announce another grandchild , Andy and Nicky have had a little boy, William was born on his due date with a few minutes to spare, a brother for Edie.

Northchapel Primary School Celebrates Glowing Report and 'Good' Grade October 12, 2023



Northchapel Primary School, Northchapel, Petworth in West Sussex, is basking in the glow of an exceptional achievement, as it recently received a meritorious Ofsted report, securing a 'Good' rating. This is not only a testament to the dedication of the school's staff and students but also a reason for celebration in the local community.

The much-anticipated report, conducted by the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services, and Skills (Ofsted), paints a vivid picture of a thriving educational institution that has risen to the challenge of delivering quality education in a small school.

The report highlighted several key areas where Northchapel Primary School excelled:
