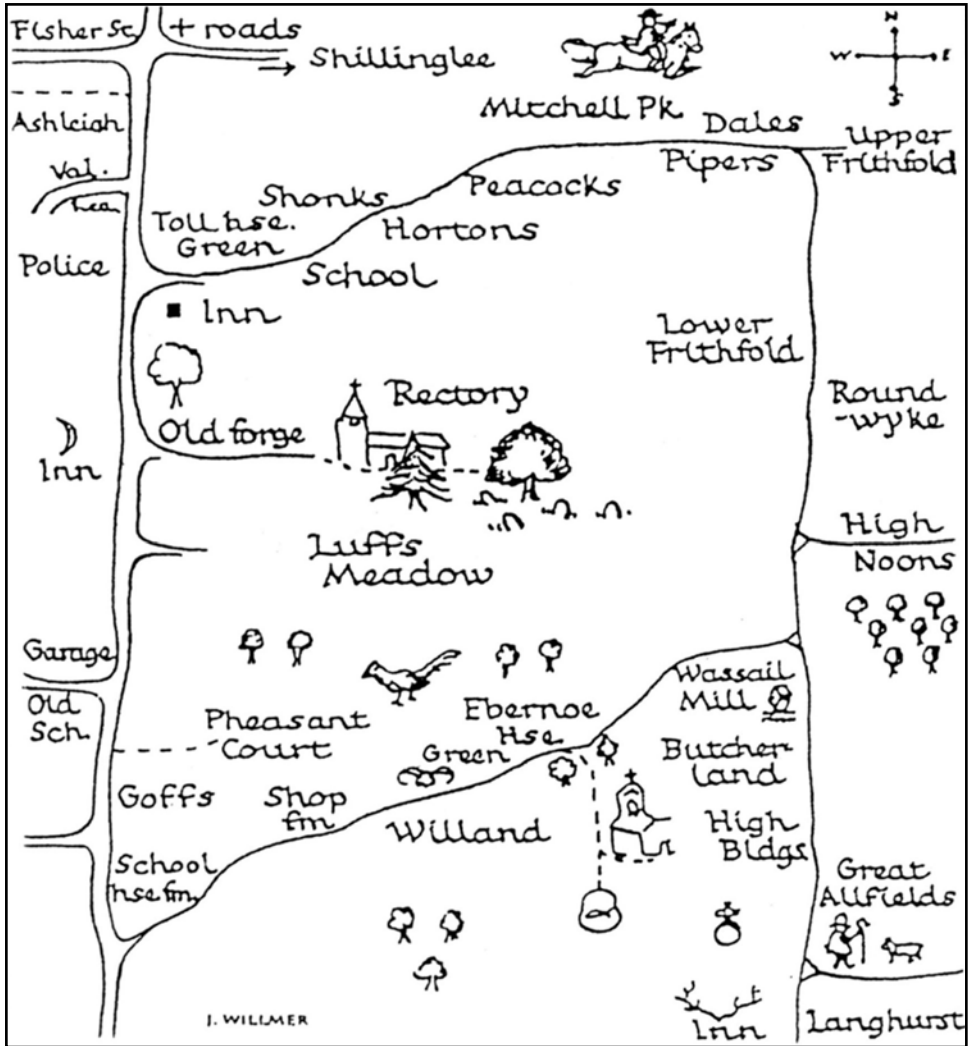

News From Ebernoe Reserve

Fortunately, our September work party took place just before the record breaking September heat wave kicked in. Roger brought two Stihl long reach electric hedge cutters from the tool store which enabled us to achieve a lot more than we could with just hand tools. We cut back vegetation from various areas including the edge of the car park, the flower-rich verges near the cattle grid and small clearings along the Green Road path. To encourage floral diversity the cut material was raked and removed to remove nutrients from the verges. We also cleared the entrances to a couple of culverts and dug out parts of a ditch that had become blocked. As it was my birthday the following day – and one of the those supposedly 'significant' ones! - I brought a cake. Slightly tongue in cheek, a '*Colin the Caterpillar*' cake seemed appropriate! After lunch we tackled the Bramble that was threatening to overwhelm the Brick Kiln area. We managed to clear this but, by this time, it was rather hot and sunny so decided it was time for ice cream at Kirdford shop.

Some of you may have noticed that the recently installed power line poles that cross the reserve have now got shiny new 'sleeves' on the bottom of them. These are '*Polesaver creosote isolation kits*' which the utility company have fitted. These have absorbent hessian behind a long lasting, weather resistant, coating. This is because, in the heat, the poles were oozing tarry liquid which was contaminating the surrounding soil, potentially damaging to the Site of Special Scientific Interest.

The Sussex Wildlife Trust has launched an appeal to enable it to purchase three fields adjoining the reserve and towards the cost of their future management. The fields are on the northern edge of Furnace Meadow. The landowner has previously worked with the Trust to improve the fields by restoring hedgerows to act as wildlife corridors. On the old Peachey estate map of 1911, one of the fields was woodland marked as Forest Copse and so the SWT has given this name to its appeal. Ebernoe Defibrillator Locations

One defibrillator is stationed at the Stag Pub on the wall to the left of the ladies toilet door. The other defibrillator is stationed at the rear of the cricket pavilion.

They do not require passwords or codes and for ease of use they both have voice instruction on how to use them

Northchapel Defibrillator Location

The defibrillator is located at the top of the Village Green by the notice board. The defibrillator may be accessed in emergencies by phoning 999 who will give you a code for the keypad enabling the door to be opened. Full instructions on how to use the defibrillator can be found inside including voice prompts

Horse Chestnut Tree Update

Some of you may have noticed that the Horse Chestnut tree on the grass opposite the Half Moon had recently lost a large bough.

Following an inspection by the CDC tree officer & our own tree surgeon, the tree had to be felled as it had been deemed unsafe.

The work took place on Tuesday 19th September, under a 5 day notice, due to it being dangerous. As part of the 5 day notice we are duty bound to plant a new replacement tree of a suitable type which will happen this Autumn.

Depending on the condition of the trunk, it will either be left standing to potentially be carved at a later date or if it's in a poor state it will be removed.

Farm Diary *by Sue Moss*

What better way to start my diary ... we have another granddaughter! Rob and Emily have become the very proud parents of Josie and are settling into a new chapter of their life together. They have appeared here at the farm a few times looking totally exhausted but are loving every minute of looking after their new daughter. I guess I will finally have to treat our youngest son as a grown up now, in my mind he is still about six !

Harvest was completed at the end of August with the combining of the two fields of Oats at Garlands, when I asked I was told it was just an average crop this year. Most of the crops this year have produced an average crop, not a bumper crop as in some years but in general okay.

We have been having some repairs carried out to the roof of the Sussex barn, it's an ongoing task to try and bring the buildings up to a good state of repair.

Christopher is busy with the annual task of hedge cutting, each year the hedges are cut back and reshaped.

Half of the Ewes have had Rams running with them, this year we have removed the Rams after five weeks to give us a tighter lambing period. At the beginning of October the second half of the Ewes will have Rams running with them and we will again remove them after the same period of time. We have purchased 125 North Country Mule lambs from Cumbria, they were born in March of this year, we intend to keep some to join our breeding flock and will sell some in the spring . They made the long journey to us on one of the recent hot days, they had a couple of stops during the eight hour journey , they were turned out into a field each time to give them a break, they arrived with us early evening and as they unloaded from the lorry it was a credit to the haulage company how well they had looked after them.

Most of our older cattle have been sold, Andy booked them in to be sold at Salisbury Market early in September, the first week 122 12 month old Angus cross breeds were sold. Andy and Julian travelled to the market, they always feel that you should go and see...

...them sold, they have looked after them since they were ten days old and it's right to stand by them as they are sold. Andy confided in me that he always felt very apprehensive watching at the sale ring as they were sold, he always has a total figure in mind that he hopes they will make, the Angus exceeded his target. The following week the Belgian Blue cross breeds were loaded onto two lorries, 84 at 12 months of age, again they travelled to watch them sold and again they made Andy's projected figure. We have kept around fifty of the older cattle which we have room to over winter, they will come in from grazing in the next few weeks. There are now around 230 young calves on the farm in one of the large barns . With the recent very hot weather Andy purchased a large fan which they have fitted above the calf pens, this will keep the air moving through the pens and is healthier for the calves and will help prevent respiratory diseases.

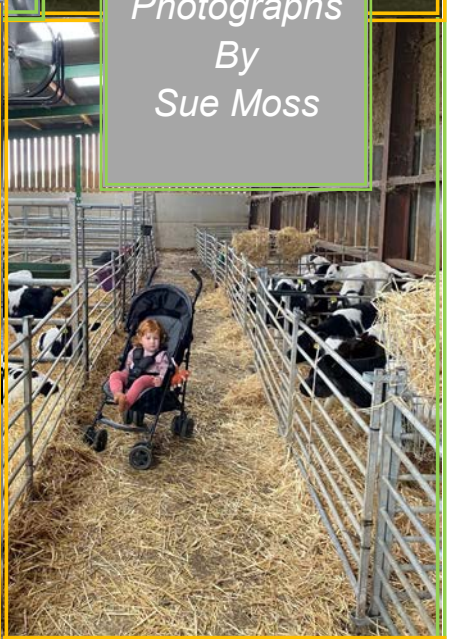
I'm sure most of the village is well aware that we have been dung spreading, unfortunately it coincided with the recent hot weather, the dung is spread as a fertiliser prior to cultivation.

We have enjoyed the recent spell of warm weather, we took a couple of trips to the beach and enjoyed watching Edie and Milly discover paddling. Our sandcastle building was not so successful as they seemed to take more pleasure in destroying them but a lovely time was enjoyed by all . After a day of sorting cattle and very little time to eat we had an impromptu fish and chips evening at the farm a couple of weeks ago, we are so lucky to have our family close by and it was quite special having our three granddaughters around the family table with us.

We have an extremely persistent mole making its way into the vegetable patch and then daring to travel across our lawn. I always quote Jasper Carrott; " There's only one way to kill a Mole..... " I'm sure those of you as old as me know the rest! When Julian and I were first married and lived away from the farm we had a vegetable patch where my chicken runs are now and we had a mole. I remember Julian sitting on guard, shooting the mole and blowing two Brussel Sprout plants out of the ground ! I fear this mole will suffer the same fate if he persists ! *(Please see Sue's Photographs overleaf!)*

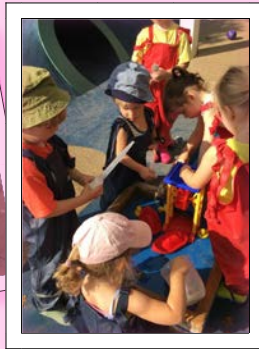

Village Speed Watch *By Laura Green*

The second speed project meeting had several new residents in attendance, all flagging the same concerns as we have previously discussed.

Residents from Chidfield Barns came with photographic evidence of several road traffic accidents over the months that highlight perfectly the dangers they now face living there with no change to road signage or speed limit.

The Parish Council shared information they had gathered since the last meeting. This will be a project for the Parish that will take time, and will come with significant costs and will require a lot evidence gathering to support any proposal. The Parish Council have learnt that for our applications to be funded under the Council's Community Highways scheme during the 2024/2025 financial year, our application had to be in by 31.07.23. Our application must submitted by 31.07.24 for consideration in the 2025/2026 financial year.

Next, the Parish Council will investigate whether the process can be accelerated if the Parish Council were to fund parts of the project themselves, it is however clear that all proposed projects will come with significant costs attached and the Parish Council will need to consider how these costs will be met. Community fundraising as well as residents contributions are two ways costs could be covered.

Early discussions with Janet Duncton, our County Councillor are positive and Janet has offered her full support.

Whilst discussions continue, our interest has been registered for a Parish Community Speed Watch Group, we currently await a reply regarding first steps in setting this up. This would be a key point in gathering evidence to support any application that we make, and will show how we as a community are looking at ways to tackle speeding ourselves.

Other action points:

- To investigate involved costs in lowering speed limits
- To Look into the traffic/highways plan that was passed with the Chidfield Barns development and investigate whether the Council do ever review them.
- All residents to continue gathering evidence of any accidents/incidents that occur as a result of speeding within the Parish. Photographs are extremely helpful and will be needed to support our proposals moving forward.
- To contact other Parishes that have been successful in having their speed limits lowered, to find out more about costs, information required and time-frames.

If you are able to get involved in any aspect of this project to help move the program forward, please contact the Parish Council.

A brand new flexible on-demand bus service, providing essential transportation in rural areas, enabling you to conveniently book reliable journeys to key destinations such as your nearest town, train station, hospital and more. A potentially really handy new bus service is now in operation within our area and it's called "Book a Bus." To book a bus, simply call the service on 01243 858854 or use the Ride Pingo Mobile App to book and pay.

Travelling around parts of the county is now easier following the introduction of "Book-a-Bus" bus service recently launched by West Sussex County Council. "Book-a-Bus" now serves the rural areas between Chichester to Petworth and North Petworth - areas that previously had limited or no traditional bus services available.

The service operates within set zones and offers to pick-up passengers in convenient locations when they need it, all for the same price as a standard bus fare. Fares are currently capped at £2 per trip until October 2023, thereafter £2.50 per trip until November 2024.

With no conventional timetable or routes, the service operates on bookings received via the "Ride Pingo" app or by phone. Drop-off points with onward connections to travel by bus or train are also included within the service zone to ensure ease of onward travel.

Editors Note: As we feel a bus service is greatly needed within our local area, and to experience the new service first hand, we booked a bus via the App on Friday 1st September to travel from Luffs Meadow to Midhurst return. However, we did encounter frustrating teething issues when booking. That said, eventually the bus arrived on time as per the App agreement and both drivers on the outward and return leg were really helpful and very optimistic about the future of Book-a-Bus. So, be prepared for issues when booking the service! We telephoned with the operators and they freely admitted they were having issues internally but they were working extremely hard to sort them quickly. So, with this in mind, we believe this will be a case of 'Either use it or lose it'.

PETWORTH FOOD BANK UPDATE – SEPTEMBER 2023

Foodbank 10-year anniversary

In June, we marked the ten years that the Chichester District Foodbank has been open with a service at Chichester Cathedral. When Joanne Kondabe-ka, CEO set up the first foodbank centre in Chichester, then the centres at Selsey, Midhurst and Petworth, it was not expected that foodbanks would still be needed by 2023 let alone that demand would be greater than ever.

We can only keep going thanks to the amazing generosity of the public in donating food and money and of the volunteers in the district who give up their time to keep the foodbank running. In our Petworth centre, we have thirty dedicated volunteers who do a range of different roles including collecting and sorting donations, packing boxes, delivering food, helping with events and speaking to clients.

Our focus is no longer only on supplying a 3-day food parcel - we want to help clients find a way out of their crisis. This means directing or signposting them to other sources of help that they may not be aware of. This can be the Citizens Advice or Supporting You, who can help to sort out utility bill payments or provide benefits or debt advice, or other charities and professionals who can provide help with a range of issues such as finding work, homelessness, mental health problems, tackling social isolation and family support.

Seaford College community action day

In June, we were fortunate to have help from Seaford College in cleaning our foodbank. Thank you very much to the two teachers who came to help us – it was a day of solid work but much was achieved.

Petworth Fete

We had our first ever stall at the fete in July. There was a great response from the public and our tombola tickets sold quickly. In total we raised over £700.

This success was in no small part down to the many wonderful prizes that were given to us by local businesses so thank you very much to them for such generous donations.....

Petworth Festival Service collection

Many thanks to all those who gave to the collection during this service at St Mary's church in Petworth in July. In total, just over £369 was raised which is a terrific contribution to our work supporting people in crisis.

Kids Lunch Packs

This summer we delivered 82 boxes of food to children in the Petworth area including the surrounding villages. Our lunch packs are provided to children who normally receive free school meals due to low income and are store cupboard staples to help cover the loss of those meals in the main school holidays.

These boxes were packed for us by Seaford College students and staff, and all the food was paid for by parents of children at the college. In addition, we were given freshly baked bread from SØDT bakery. We are so grateful for all this incredible support.

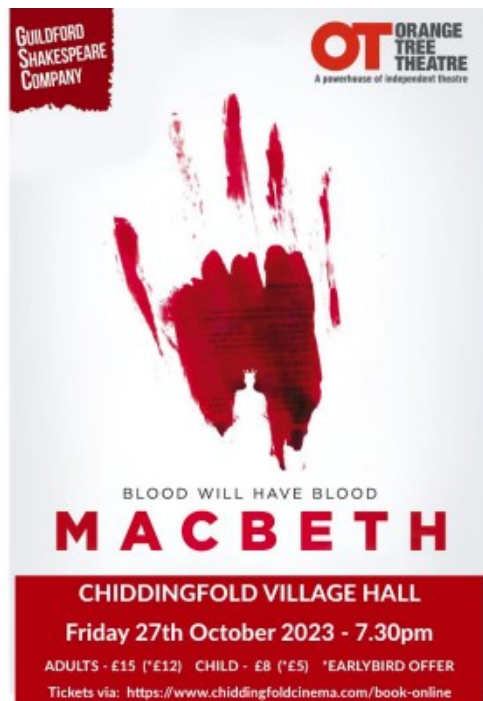

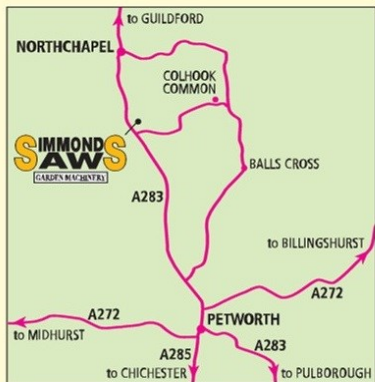
