# News From Ebernoe Reserve

What do Shoreham, Worthing, Littlehampton, Chichester, Henfield, Horsham, Midhurst, and Billingshurst have in common? ... They are all places where volunteers who work on the reserve come from, illustrating the long distances travelled by some and their commitment to helping manage this nationally important wildlife site. A few local residents, notably Clifford and Guy, help us but it would be great if any of you are able to make it a resolution to come and help us in the New Year!

The Wildlife Trust has employed a contractor to cut scrubby regeneration in Furnace Meadow and various glades and other open areas. As a consequence, our recent work parties have focussed on collecting and burning the cut vegetation in Furnace Meadow. It is important to do this to avoid smothering less robust species of plant and to remove nutrients which would otherwise act as fertiliser encouraging coarse, dominant, species at the expense of more sensitive species. Given the amount of rain that we have had, the prospect of trying to burn lots of damp material was, to say the least, somewhat 'challenging'. However, years of experience have taught me how best to go about this and we soon get a fire going. Our December task was time for what has in recent years become almost a pre-Christmas tradition – whereby I provide 'shots' of Rochester® Ginger. [Other brands may be available.] This traditional ginger drink packs a warming kick, which is welcome working in cold conditions outside, but contains no alcohol.

I chose a nice, sunny morning to do some further repair work on the steps down from the church to Furnace Pond – replacing a rotten riser with a new one and making good the surrounding step. Whilst there I decided to do a bit of work clearing young Holly from around the old Oak trees nearby, which, amongst other things, are important for their lichen flora which could be at risk if Holly grew to smother it. I saw an interesting comment recently from Plantlife that their work in SW England removing Holly dramatically improved the levels of light and air flow around the trunks of veteran trees causing a massive increase in the number of lichens. However, the situation at Ebernoe is complicated by the needs to balance such aspects with the needs of other rare species such as some bats which may roost and breed in old trees.

## Farm Diary *by Sue Moss*

As the year draws to a close we are definitely hoping for a drier start to 2024. A lot of the past month has been spent moving Sheep from field to field to allow them fresh grazing. In a couple of weeks the remaining lambs that did not get to the required weight to go to market as fat Lambs will be moved to graze the turnip and kale crop that is growing in the field behind Honeydowns. The pregnant Ewes are now being fed a dry supplement to prepare them for lambing early in the new year.

**C**alves that were penned in one of the large barns have been moved into a different barn for the winter, this area will be mucked out and used for storage of machinery. As well as here at the farm we have cattle in two other locations, we house them away from the farm to give us more space for lambing. Another of the large barns will be prepared for lambing, we build individual pens to house the ewes and lambs, if necessary we also have large pens that the ewes and young lambs can be housed in if the weather stops us from turning them out into the fields.

**W**e usually buy our replacement fencing posts from a local supplier but this year it was proposed that we would cut our own. Andy decided a new chainsaw was necessary so paid a visit to our friendly garden machinery expert and a deal was done! The next day was spent coppicing, Andy was cutting the posts, Julian was pointing them and Rob was splitting and stacking them. They came home from a day in the woods completely worn out smelling very smoky from the fire and extremely pleased with the 150 posts that were cut.

I bought some female day old chicks in August, they are now fully grown beautiful brown Hens which should begin to lay early in the new year. Before they join my existing group of laying birds we will be mucking out and disinfecting the old cowshed that they are housed in. Having lost my old Cockerel known as Biscuit (he was Ginger) in the summer, I was fortunate to be offered a new handsome chap who needed a home. He came from a KFC loving family and is called Popcorn.

... I have always thought it's a sign that you are getting old when time passes quickly, this year seems to have flown by so I guess I fall into that category now! We have had a good year on the farm, sometimes challenging but mainly rewarding, if we are facing a testing time Julian's usual comment is "If farming was easy, everyone would do it".

**With** the arrival of two more grandchildren this year we now have four, Edie the eldest will celebrate her second birthday a couple of days before Christmas. Once a week we usually all have lunch together, it's often bedlam but I love it, it's lovely watching their little characters developing.

**As** we look towards the New Year we will soon be lambing, I have six of my Zwartble ewes in lamb so am hoping for some pretty additions to my little flock. Some dry weather would be very much appreciated !

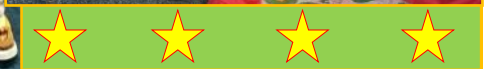

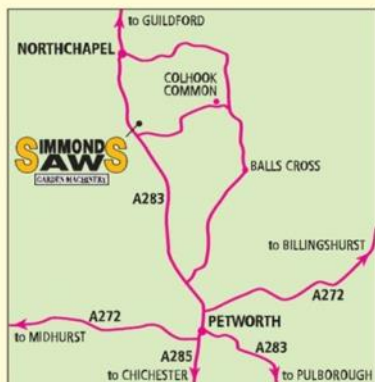
