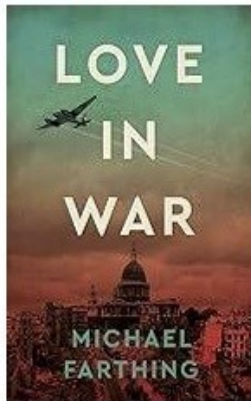

# District Councillors Report

Dear Residents,

I hope that you all managed to have a break over Easter and are enjoying Spring and the longer days. Please see below some updates on what Gareth and I have been supporting residents with locally, as well as an update on wider District Council matters. Do feel free to get in touch if there is anything that you think we can help with.

## Local Updates

**Local Plan** – We are expecting an update on the submission of the Chichester Local Plan very shortly and hope to be able to update residents next month.

**Hyde Housing** – David Betts, CDC Cabinet Member for Housing & Communities, is in regular contact with Gareth and Charles regarding issues with Hyde and unacceptable living conditions that some of our residents endure. David is in dialogue with senior members of staff at CDC and Hyde to hold them to account for resolving these issues.

**Hollyview Close** – Gareth is awaiting a response from CDC Enforcement regarding the lack of tree coverage / landscaping at this recent development in Loxwood. If residents have any other issues regarding Planning Enforcement then please get in touch.

## CDC Wide Updates

### Full Council Meeting Held on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> March:

At the most recent Full Council meeting, Councillors passed resolutions to:

- ◆ Begin the process to introduce a household food waste collection service across the District. This is in response to a Government mandate that all councils must provide this by 2026.

## *District Councillors Report Continued....*

- ◆ Introduce a 100% Council Tax Premium on second homes in the District
- ◆ Write to our MPs and the Department of Health urging them to ensure that the funding to the Sussex Dementia Assessment service remains in place and that the future of the service is guaranteed. The service was recently suspended for new patients and local charity, Sage House, has had to step in to fill the gap. As something that is very close to many of our Councillors' hearts, we felt compelled to act and highlight this issue that will have an impact on so many of our residents.

### **Fly-Tipping**

On 18<sup>th</sup> March a multi-agency joint operation took place at multiple locations on the county border. Officers from Sussex Police, Environment Agency, Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency, Chichester District Council and West Sussex County Council came together to stop vehicles that may be carrying waste; checking compliance; and interviewing drivers. This is one of a number of similar operations that have taken place across West Sussex, with the aim of disrupting and deterring fly-tipping.

# News From Ebernoe Reserve

As I write this the Nightingales are arriving. I heard my first of the season at Woods Mill, Henfield, on 5th April and then at Ebernoe on the 6th. From the Sussex Ornithological Society website it was apparent that they were being seen at a number of places having just arrived with the southerly plume of warm air. We should hopefully be able to enjoy their song throughout much of May, although birds singing late in the season are likely to be males that have failed to find a partner. The rate at which the countryside is turning green is amazing with, over just a few days, trees rapidly breaking bud and coming into leaf and a variety of plants coming into flower seemingly quite early. The photo, taken two years ago, of the veteran Oak at Pass Green and its ground flora indicate what we look forward to.

**M**y volunteer group has continued with habitat management, though mindful of the nesting season starting. In Willand Wood we worked in the wooded valley east of the Grigs Brook stream which flows into Furnace Pond. This area is one Frances Abraham has noted as species-rich with many ancient woodland indicators such as Bluebell, Wood Mellick, Wood Sedge, Remote Sedge, Pignut, Hairy Wood-rush and Southern Wood-rush. Holly was starting to colonise the woodland and, in due course, would shade out much of this flora as it has elsewhere. Taking advantage of the damp conditions, we were able to easily uproot young Holly from a large area and thus prevent a problem – at least for now!

**O**ur Saturday group set off to work in Leconfield Glade in the south of the reserve but only got about 100 metres when we found the Siband Track blocked by a fallen tree. Fortunately we had some large bow saws with us and were able to cut up and clear the blockage. By the time we got to Leconfield I reckoned we had earned our elevenses! Somewhat refreshed, we then set to cutting some of the Holly that had regrown after an earlier clearance. This helps keep the open aspect of this glade where the Beech trees support a rich lichen flora including some rare species. As a reminder that some people find navigating in the woodland tricky, we were able to direct one, slightly disorientated, visitor to the route back to the car park.

The defibrillator may be accessed in emergencies by phoning 999 who will give you a code for the keypad enabling the door to be opened. 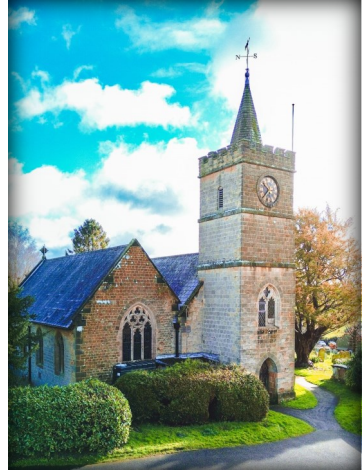

## The Northchapel MUGA Project

We are delighted to announce the first project grant has been successfully secured by the Northchapel MUGA project. Chichester District Council (CDC) have awarded the project £20,000 which takes the MUGA total to over £50,000. Total cost for the MUGA installation is projected to be around £120,000. Conditions for the grant dictate the money must be spent and project completed within the next 12 months. There's still a long way to go to reach the total required to complete the project, but this first grant has given the project a much needed boost to momentum.

With one more grant application already completed, two more grants are in the pipeline and at the planning stage before they can be submitted. In addition to the grants, we will be reaching out to local investors for help with further funds.

## Farm Diary *by Sue Moss*

With hardly a break in the wet weather we had only managed to apply fertiliser to some of the crops as we were unable to travel on the land. When our agronomist visited his observation was that our crops were hungry and waterlogged and he advised that we get fertiliser applied as soon as possible.

As it is now possible to apply fertiliser by drone it was decided that we would give it a go. We had a very interesting day observing quite a large drone being flown low to the ground whilst carrying out an aerial application of plant nutrients on three of our fields that are very waterlogged, with a few hiccups at the start it was later running really well. It has certain challenges that show it to be in its infancy, mainly battery life, but we were pleased with the results and the crop has already improved.

We sold the remainder of the Hoggets that had been grazing the turnip and kale mix at Honeydowns. The price of lamb remains extremely high and again we were very happy with how they sold at Ashford Market. We also sold around twenty ewes that failed to get in lamb they are known as barren ewes. We always use the same livestock haulier ( he has recently invested in a new purpose built lorry ), to take the animals to market he starts the day early and calls at various farms loading their livestock for sale before making the journey to Ashford.

The fields at Honeydowns have been sprayed off, the top two have been ploughed and the other will be in the next few days. We have moved away from ploughing but with conditions so wet our only option this year is to plough. Rob found it quite a novelty to get the plough back out. We will be sowing Oats in the top fields and Wholecrop in the large field, this is a mixture of Oats and Vetch that will be cut, baled and wrapped to feed to the cattle.

## *Farm Diary Continued...*

Most of the sheep have been moved off of the farm to allow the grass fields to recover and grow ready for the cattle who will be turned out as soon as it is dry enough. To get the cattle ready for turn out they have been sorted into age and breed groups.

Having kept my young Guinea fowl in outdoor pens longer than usual we have recently released them in the hope they will join the older ones. During the day they are all together but they don't roost in the oak tree with the older ones and return to the pens every night. I'm feeling quite smug this year as I have found their eggs really easily, they taste delicious and have a rich dark orange yolk.

The Easter Bunny (Julian) visited our garden hiding little chocolate treats and we all enjoyed encouraging Edie and Milly to find them, Josie also joined in, she wasn't great at finding but was very good at eating chocolate!

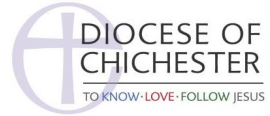

## **Vegetable & Flower Show Recipe**

### **Chocolate and Vanilla Marble Cake**

*See page 28*

- 300g of butter
- 200g of caster sugar
- 4 free-range eggs, lightly whisked
- 200g of self-raising flour
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 3 tbsp of cocoa powder
- 2 tbsp of milk

1. Preheat the oven to 170°C/gas mark 3. Line a 30cm loaf tin with baking paper
2. Whisk together the butter, sugar and vanilla essence until pale and fluffy
3. Whisk in the eggs a little at a time until fully incorporated
4. Gently fold in the flour in 2 stages, then place  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the mix into a separate bowl and fold in the cocoa powder
5. The mix should gently fall from a spoon when lifted – if it is a little thick let it down with the milk
6. Pour  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the vanilla batter into the lined tin and spread out evenly. Pour  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the chocolate mixture on top in a swirling motion then cover with the remaining vanilla mixture
7. Finish with the rest of the chocolate mixture then use a metal skewer to swirl the chocolate through the vanilla to create the marbled effect
8. Bake for 45–50 minutes, until a metal skewer inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean. Leave to cool on a wire rack before slicing and serving.

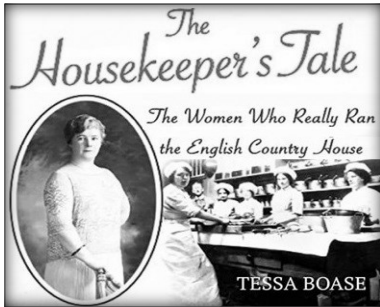
